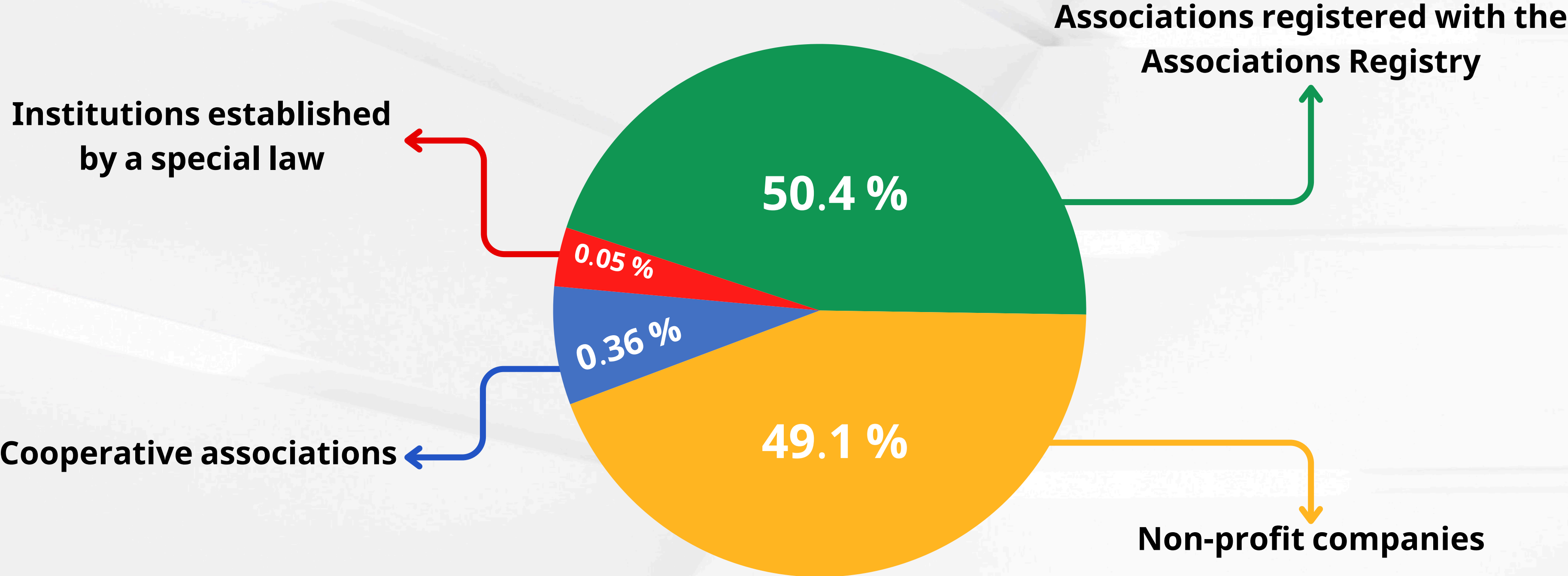

## Foreign Funding to Associations, Non-profit companies, and Cooperative Unions in 2023

### Foreign Funding Volume

- The total Funding received by Associations, Non-profit companies, and Cooperative Unions (approved by the Council of Ministers) amounted to 50.946 million JODs, including microfinance loans amounting to 7.810 million JODs (15.3% of the overall funding volume).
- Non-profit companies received 49.1% of the overall funding, while registered associations received 50.4%, and cooperative associations received less than 1%. One foundation established by a special law executed only one project amounted to 24,800 JOD.
- In terms of project count, 54 non-profit companies received 25.03 million JODs for 95 projects, while 108 associations received 25.7 million JODs for 221 projects. The average funding per project stood at 263,000 JOD for non-profit companies and 116,000 JOD for Associations. Cooperative unions received only 182,000 JODs for 7 projects.

# Foreign Funding Volume for 2023

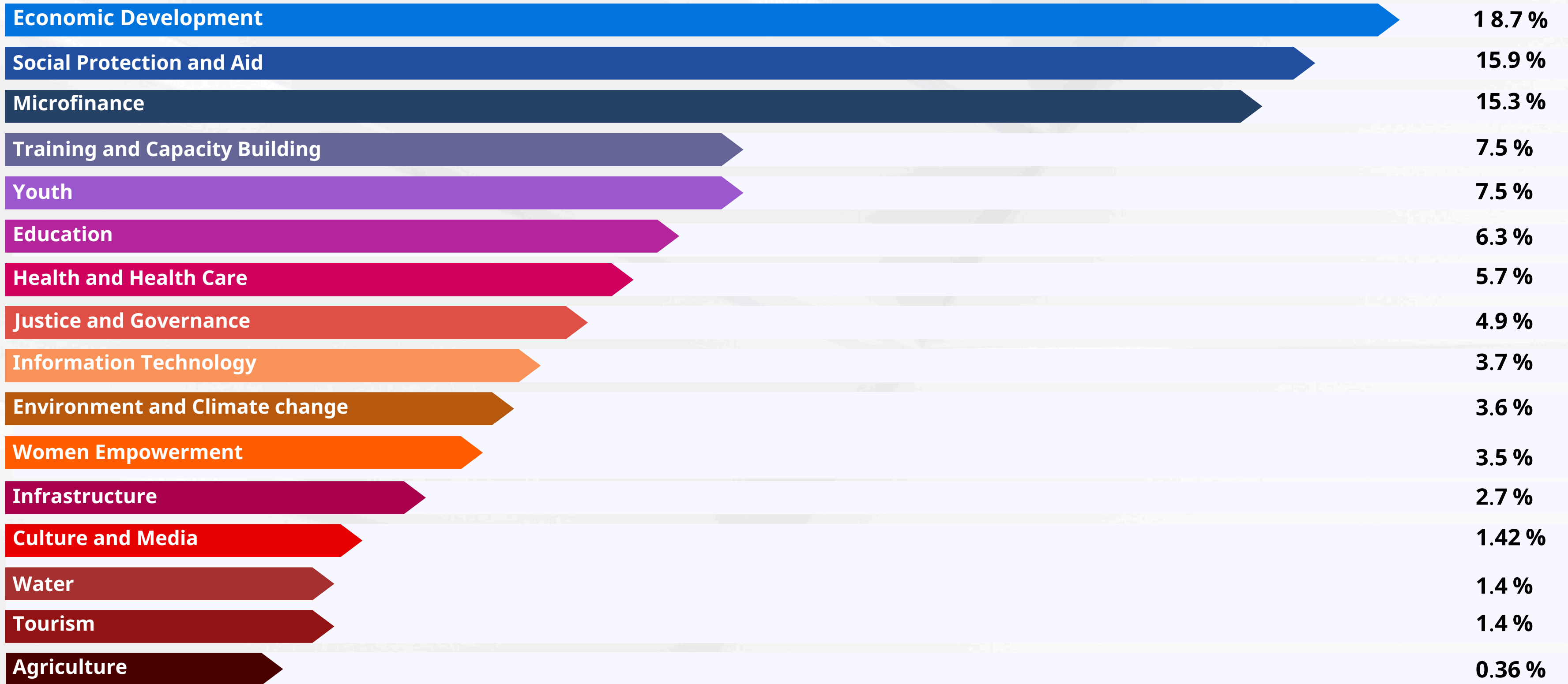

## Priorities and Objectives

The sectors of economic development, microfinance, social protection, and training and capacity building emerged as primary priorities for foreign funding among civil society institutions in 2023. Economic development led with a total of 9.538 million JODs, constituting (18.7%) of the total funding, followed by social protection with 8.096 million JODs (15.9%), and microfinance with 7.810 million JODs (15.3%). Sectors such as agriculture, tourism, culture, and media held lower priority among civil society institutions and donor communities.
